Cyclone 'Gaja' Relief Service

The cyclone 'Gaja' meaning 'The Elephant' began to make its landfall along the coastal line of Nagapattinam District causing unexpected damages to the dwelling huts and thatched houses. It pulled down not only coconut trees but also the dwelling huts and shelters. The aftermath of Cyclone 'Gaja' made one witness the unfathomable havoc in the livelihood of the poor to the extent that many were left abandoned on the streets with practically no place to dwell, no support to rehabilitate them and no person to offer them a hand. The after effects of Cyclone 'Gaja' left the poor widows in particular shattered in hope, disappointed in emotional support and desperate in material needs. Adding fuel to their woes, the unemployment problem due to climate change augmented their distress to rebuild their houses, as many of the afflicted were the daily wagers in the farming land.

On seeing the untold woes of the afflicted, along with Kalangarai, many individuals with merciful heart voluntarily came forward to offering relief materials to the needy poor widows who had been badly broken down materially and emotionally. One among them is Mr Kulandai Francis, Founder President, IVDP, Krishnagiri. He offered 'Tarpaulin, Solar Light, Blanket and Mosquito Net' worth of Rs 3000/-per head to the anguished with the aim of supporting

them with temporary shelters under feasible environment to live during the crises. Valuing and appreciating the intention of the donor, Kalangarai carried out the Rehabilitation Efforts in the following manner.

- Phase 1: Assessing the damages caused
- Phase 2: Preparing the list of deserving families
- Phase 3: Distributing the beneficiaries the Relief Materials

Accordingly, in consultation with Kalangarai, the zonal leaders of Widows' Self-help Groups in Nagai and Vedharanyam, which are the most affected taluks in Nagapattinam District, too prepared the list of beneficiaries belonging to only the Widows' Self-help Groups in Nagai Taluk and to all the Scheduled Caste (SC) chosen from the most stricken six hamlets in Vedharanyam Taluk, where the Widows' Self-help Groups are present. Following the distribution plan, IVDP distributed the relief materials to the most afflicted in the two taluks(Nagai and Vedharanyam) respectively.

Procedural Narration of Relief Distribution

Distribution of Relief Materials comprises two stages: 1. Preliminary Ground Works 2. Distribution Programme



1. Preliminary Ground Works:

On seeing the woes of the affected people, the Director of Kalangarai initially wrote an email to the Founder President of IVDP requesting him of the possibilities to offer a helping hand to those 2,000 people on the face of crises. In a response to that request, the IVDP decided to pay a visit to the affected spots; assessed the pathetic situation of the affected and chose to help out 1,000 people. On a discussion over the IVDP's choice, Kalangarai agreed upon helping out 750 people from widows' selfhelp groups and 250 people from Inner Wheel Foundation (SOS). As a follow up, IVDP asked Kalangarai to send in a formal request letter seeking the assistance of IVDP to the afflicted. In a response, IVDP sent a formal application form that each beneficiary filled in and affixed either signature or thumb print with a passport size photo and Xerox copies of Aathar Card and Ration Card of theirs.

2. Distribution Programme:

First Phase: As regards the selection of the beneficiaries, after consulting the zonal leaders of widows' self-help groups, Kalangarai arrived at choosing 525 beneficiaries, outside the Widows' Self-help Groups, from five Dalit villages (Thethakkudi, Kuravapulam, Underkadu, Ayakkaranpulam and Pannal) which are the

most stricken in Vedharanyam Taluk, and 225 beneficiaries within the Widows' Selfhelp Groups from Nagapattinam Taluk, while Inner Wheel Foundation(SOS) identified 250 beneficiaries from Thirukuvalai Talukaltogether comprising 1,000 people. Moreover, Kalangarai too proposed the types of relief materials, namely Tarpaulin, Blanket, Solar light and Mosquito net, that could be distributed to the afflicted. On following the distribution plan, IVDP initiated the first phase of distribution of relief materials on 5th January 2019 in Nagappatinam Taluk (in the morning to those beneficiaries of SOS and in the afternoon to those beneficiaries of Kalangrai) and on 6th January 2019 in Vedharanyam Taluk respectively.

Second Phase: Responding to the woes of the affected within the Widows' Self-help Groups, in Vedharanyam Taluk, Kalangarai once again placed a request to IVDP to offer Tarpaulin and Mosquito net while Kalangarai would offer solar light and blanket to those afflicted. Reacting positively to the request of Kalangarai, IVDP agreed upon the distribution of those two materials namely Tarpaulin and Mosquito net, and distributed them to those 325 beneficiaries in the second phase on 27th February 2019 when the Women's Day celebration was anticipated and celebrated by Widows' Federation.



Narration on Socio-Economic Status and Woes of the Afflicted

Socio-Economic Status of the Afflicted:

- 90 percent of beneficiaries belong to Scheduled Castes (SC) and rest of 10 percent of beneficiaries belong to Backward Communities (BC) including Muslims and Christians.
- 600 out of 1325 live in thatched houses while some live in asbestos sheeted houses and in mud tiled houses; and a very few live in concrete houses that are recently built under Govt. Cluster Housing Scheme.
- Most of the beneficiaries are daily wagers in farming land.

Woes of the Afflicted:

The aftereffects of cyclone 'Gaja' left most of the peopleabandoned on the streets. As many of the electrical posts were uprooted, there was no supply of electricity more than a month. As the village was partially inundated and the drinking water pipelines were damaged, there was no proper drinking water supply. Due to debris and make-shift rehabilitation camps of the affected, there was total road blockage leaving people with practically no access to transportation and daily essential commodities. Except those concrete houses that had been built recently under Govt. Cluster Housing Scheme, the rest of all houses including old concrete houses were badly hit. No wonder, one could not but imagine the damage caused to thatched huts, asbestos sheeted houses and mud tiled houses. As a consequence, people had recourse to make-shift rehabilitation camps and courtyard of neighbours whose houses were rather damaged.

Responding to the distress of the afflicted, some volunteers initiated the distribution of relief materials. Those people who were near the road side and those who were voiced in local could avail the benefits. To the usual, those people who were in interior and those who were voiceless were left unattended and uncared. Unfortunately, those unattended and uncared were the target population of Kalangarai mission.

The Benefits of Relief Materials:

- Due to inundation, as there was stagnant water everywhere, people were condemned to live under a condition where there was mosquito breeding. Thanks to Mosquito Net, offered by IVDP, that protected the people from mosquitoes.
- As the crises of cyclone 'Gaja' took place during winter season, blanket offered by IVDP served them to protect themselves from cold.
- Thanks to Tarpaulin that served some as temporary shelter to rest, as floor to lie down and so forth.
- Solar light had served them to lit their houses more than a month, until the local panjayat assured them of the supply of electricity.

4, Rajammal R, 70yrs, Neivilakku South, Vedharanyam Taluk


