#### Dear Friends,

Around the world including India, women have been subjected to various forms of violent and criminal acts within the household, workplace, educational institutions, and in other public place. These include verbal abuse, physical abuse, rape, sexual harassment, acid attacks and other forms of mistreatments. Criminal and violent acts against women can be hurting and result in serious injury.

The women need to strengthen themselves by building up their inner strengths. They should take independent decisions regarding their careers, professions, choices in matters of life partners, etc. They should have a say in all important matters of the family. They should be taught to be self reliant and should not depend on anyone to meet their financial needs.

In this direction, the IVDP empower the women to lead independent lives and inculcate the process to change the distribution of power, both in interpersonal relations and in institutions throughout the society. Further the IVDP works on increasing their moral strengths and face the world without fear. As a result the women are learned to be bold and outgoing in these days of modernism.

In this journey with women, the IVDP have crossed 41 glorious years and received much national and international recognition for its selfless services. In this process we have added **499 new SHGs** in 2019-2020. With this, the total number of our SHGs have increased to **13,851** which consists of **2,56,244** women members. Their overall financial transactions have reached the new height of **Rs. 897.47 Crores.** 

As we did in the past several years, helping others is become the culture of IVDP. Towards this gesture, the IVDP extends its support to needy people and various sectors like education, infrastructure development, scholarships, child welfare, water and sanitation programmes, skill training, emergency relief services, community development programmes, etc., During 2019-2020, IVDP have spent **Rs. 10.28 Crores** for these philanthropic activities.

In 2019-2020, during the end of our financial year we faced severe setback due to COVID 19. All our programmes and activities were under lockdown. The next few months will be difficult, but the IVDP is strong with deep relationships with its SHG members and partners. In spite of our difficult situation, we supported the COVID 19 prevention programmes and the dietary needs of the marginalized people in our society.

As a special initiative, this year we have taken up new projects for Nilgiris district with the **Rs. 1 Crore** contribution of our SHG members. Through which we built 5 Anganwadi (ICDS) centres and provided cots and mattresses for the children staying in tribal welfare hostels in Nilgiris district.

The IVDP is well poised to take the lead in partnering our SHG members to recover and rebound on to their growth and transformation journeys. On behalf of myself and the Board members of IVDP, I want to thank all our beloved staff, animators, well wishers and members for your continued trust, confidence, and support.






IVDP was founded in **1979 at Motragi Village**, Natrampalayam

# WATERSHED PROJECTS

From 1979 to 2002 IVDP initiated watershed programs around the hills of the Denkanikottai and Thally Regions. This involved with planning and construction of 92 major and 239 minor check dams, built across streams and gullies in the hilly region. The check dams are designed to retain monsoon rains, leading to the increased groundwater levels and storing water for the irrigation, livestock and domestic requirements of the villagers.

The check dams construction resulted in groundwater levels rising by 40 feet leading to successful harvests throughout the year. It has also created water stores allowing the inhabitants to get settled in their native villages. The benefits are being appreciated by 40,000 people across 60 villages in the region.



## **SELF HELP GROUPS**

hen Mr. Kulandai Francis was constantly thinking of bringing transformation among the poor villagers, he came out with a novel idea of forming groups for their development. At first, he started men SHG and it was not successful as the members were so irregular and failed to repay their loans.

Then he shifted his concentration towards women in 1985 and started a Annai Velankanni SHG with 12 members in Sesurajapuram. This first group collected only 50 paise as savings.


# - CHILD FRIENDLY VILLAGE - PLANNING PROJECT - UNICEF


# IVDP COMPUTER ACADEMY HANUMANTHAPURAM

## KERALA FLOOD RELIEF




On 15th October 2018, the IVDP President "Ramon Magsaysay" **Mr. KULANDAI FRANCIS** handed over the demand draft worth of

Like "Little Drops of Water Make the Mighty Ocean" the IVDP have raised a huge amount of Rs. 1 Crore for flood relief.



## **CYCLONE GAJA**

CYCOLONE GAJA, a major landfall over Tamil Nadu coast on 16th November, 2018, leaving behind a huge trail of destruction in the districts of Nagapattinam, Cuddalore, Thanjavur, Tiruvarur and Pudukottai.





To respond this emergency situation and sustain the affected families, IVDP provided the relief package containing solar lamps, bed sheets, tarpaulins and mosquito nets to 7500 families in the cyclone affected districts.



IVDP Women Groups in 10 Blocks of Krishnagiri District Upto March 2020





IVDP Women Groups in 6 Blocks of Tirupattur District Upto March 2020



# LOCATION OF HEAD OFFICE AND FIELD OFFICES OF IVDP UPTO MARCH 2020





#### **RESPONSE TO COVID 19**

#### - SUPPORT TO DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

Coronavirus disease (COVID 19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered coronavirus. Many countries around the world have seen cases of COVID 19 and several have seen outbreaks it had emerged has a global pandemic. There is no vaccine and no specific antiviral drugs to prevent or treat COVID 19.



Since March 25, India has been under lockdown because of COVID 19. There was a total lockdown across the country. All establishments were closed. Markets remained closed. Many states instituted curfews; and most of the people stayed indoors.



To face this unusual situation, the state and central governments were prepared themselves in many ways to protect their people.

In order to support the initiatives of the district administration, IVDP President Mr. **Kulandai Francis** donated and handed over the demand draft for

#### **PROJECTS FOR**

#### **NILGIRIS DISTRICT**

In August 2019, incessant rainfall in Nilgiris had claimed six lives and left over eight people injured at last count, due to the avalanches, building collapses and rising water levels, even large swathes of agricultural land and roads in the region were damaged due to the flood.



According to the Weather Channel, the region recorded 2500 mm of rainfall in four days, the highest that has ever been recorded in Nilgiris district untill today.



In this emergency situation, the IVDP swung into action to help the people who had been displaced by the floods by providing them with relief assistance. For this purpose the IVDP placed an appeal to its SHG members and raised **Rs. 1 Crore**. In order to know the real needs of the people in Nilgiris disrict, the IVDP President had a discussion with the Nilgiris District Collector, **Mrs. Innocent Divya**, IAS., and finalized the following programmes for the welfare of the children in Nilgiris District.

#### PROJECT 1





Reconstruction of five damaged ICDS (Anganwadi) centers in Padanthurai, Puthur Vayal, Pandhalur, Puliampara and Nanthatti villages in Gudalur taluk of Nilgiris District each cost of **Rs. 8.85 Lakhs.** 

The total cost of the project is Rs. 44.25 Lakhs.

#### PROJECT 2





Provided 380 Steel Cots and 740 Kurlon Mattresses for the children staying in Tribal and Adi Dravider welfare hostels in

Nilgiris district at the cost of Rs. 56 Lakhs.

In 380 two tire steel cots, 760 Children can sleep.

#### **SELF HELP GROUPS**

The IVDP is pioneer in promoting and organizing the women into groups. The IVDP SHGs have the high standards of operational procedures and professional methods.

Generally the Self-Help Group (SHG) refers to self-governed, peer controlled, informal group of people with same socio-economic background and have a desire to collectively perform common purposes. Here poor people voluntarily come together to save whatever amount they can save conveniently out of their earnings, to mutually agree to contribute to the common fund and to lend to the members for meeting their productive and emergent needs.

The IVDP Self Help Groups have revolutionised the lives of millions of women across Krishnagiri, Dharmapuri, Tirupattur and Vellore districts of Tamil Nadu and use them as a tool to keep women connected, financially supported and to build their confidence in pursuing income generating opportunities.

IVDP interacts with rural women to build awareness on various issues which they are facing and ways by which they can overcome them. It leads to introduction of SHG where women inculcate a habit of saving, have availability of finances in an emergency situation as well as for need-based requirements.



#### **OBJECTIVES OF IVDP SHGS**

- To inculcate the savings and banking habits among members.
- To secure them from financial, technical and moral strengths.
- To enable the availability of loan for productive purposes.
- To gain economic prosperity through loans credit.
- To gain from collective wisdom in organising and managing their own finance and distributing the benefits among themselves.



# **LOANS**

SHG members require financial support for meeting their productive and emergent credit needs. Irrespective of their livelihood jobs, every member avails either one or more loans and make use of the money for their livelihood activities like small business, agricultural work, house construction, educational expenses, marriage expenses, debt swapping, etc.

The credit facilities given to the poor rural women by the financial institutions are bringing significant changes in their lives. The quantum of the loan is fixed, depends on the saving corpus of the group.

The IVDP is committed to bring about women empowerment through women SHGs by means of facilitating various loans at a reasonable rate of interest.

# TYPES OF LOANS AVAILED BY IVDP SHG MEMBERS

- Sangha loan (from the savings) at the reasonable interest rate fixed by the groups.
- Sangha Special Loan
- 3. IVDP loan
- Bank loan: Here the bank loans are sanctioned only to the group accounts. Naturally all members become equally responsible for the loan amount sanctioned. If a member fails to repay the loan, all other remaining members should take the responsibility of the repayment.

Apart from the sangha loans, the groups also have easy access to get either IVDP loan or bank loan.

# RATE OF INTEREST

### FOR SHG BANK LOANS

Private money lenders charging a interest at which exploits the poor people in the villages. But IVDP offers the loans to its SHG members with same rate of interest, which commercial banks are charging for its loans.

The IVDP SHGs in Dharmapuri and Vellore districts avails the loans from banks as per the concessions given by the NRLM project norms. According to that, the SHGs are getting loans with the interest subvention of 3% and the additional subsidy of 4% per annum for the loans up to Rs. 3 lakhs. This reduces their interest burdens further.




Group Reserve Fund is nothing but the exclusive savings of the IVDP SHG.





# **AUDIT ENSURES**

## **ACCOUNTABILITY**

The undertaking of the audit provides important and valuable insight. An audit determines whether an SHG is providing a true and fair view of its financial performance and various other aspects related to its functioning. In IVDP, the audit will assess the quality of recording of books of accounts by SHGs, verify individual pass books of SHG members, reconciliation of bank passbook and SHG books of account, assist the members to ensure that the federated SHGs and its members have utilized the credit in the manner and purpose, infuses confidence among the bankers that the SHGs are being properly monitored and regularly verified by the SHG federation and come out with training needs of the SHG, which has been audited.

#### The audit ensures:

- Regular cash transaction or misappropriations if any are found out and suitable action is taken to solvetheproblems.
- Wrong entries, missing entries, income and expenditure / transaction are found out and suitable action is taken.
- Audit enables and qualifies groups to avail various loans.
- Audit helps the groups to stabilise or establish their sound financial position.
- Grading the SHGs and animators, based on the performance in credit linkage activities.

Consolidating the income, expenditure and accounting of financial transactions of the SHGs for a particular period of time (April to March) are audited by a group of IVDP staff.

#### Kinds of Audit

- 1. Internal Audit
- 2. External Audit
- 3. Group Grading
- 4. Animators Grading

#### Internal audit and its special features

The accounts of SHGs belonging to cluster level federation are verified by the full time field supervisors of another CLF. Internal Audit will be conducted once in every three months. All the records in connection with the group transactions and bank statements will be verified in the audit. The auditing will also instruct the groups to clear their dues in the bank.

#### External audit and its special features

A group of experts in the IVDP head office under the able guidance and supervision of an external auditor verifies income, expenditure and all the transactions of the groups at the end of every financial year and gives grading to the groups. Producing bank statement, getting no due certificate from the bank, evaluation and grading, rectification of the errors and arriving a detailed balance sheet are the special features of the external audit. First, the team will audit the groups manually then it will be cross checked with the entries in software.

Finally the audit statement will be prepared and sent to chartered accountant for his final approval.

# **DIVIDEND: SHARED INTEREST**

The Self Help Group members are rotating their savings among the members for a nominal interest. First time the accumulated interest over the period of five years is shared among themselves, and after the fifth year once in two years the accumulated interest will be shared among themselves after deducting the group's expenditures. This is known as dividend.

This creates a faith over the group activities and motivates them to save more money through their SHGs.

Cumulatively right from 2003 to 2019 IVDP SHGs shared Rs. 589 crores as dividend among the members.

The SHG are allowed to keep Rs. 20000 in their accounts. At the time of disbursement of dividend, the members who are having more than Rs. 20000 will be treated as excess savings and the same will be distributed along with the dividend.





The IVDP SHG software manages the IVDP SHGs most efficiently with maximum accuracy to enhance trustworthiness and credibility. The digitalization of SHGs accounts and operations are very well adopted by the IVDP self group members and given positive response.

Now the group members are viewing all their transactions and operations in the tab and operating it through the finger print device. This enables a comprehensive information base and effective MIS system, which may facilitate suitable interventions and convergence of other programme for social and financial empowerment.

Further it will help in identifying suitable interventions and support for proper nurturing and strengthening of SHGs.



# **METHODOLOGY**

- All SHG members' finger prints will be collected and stored in IVDP server.
- All the loan repayments will be entered in front of the members and acknowledged by the same member.
- Collections entered in the TAB will immediately move to IVDP

  MIS portal (Management Information System) and Cluster Desktop.
- The SHG's transactions and activities will be monitored from the Head office
- 5 SMS alert will be sent to group member's mobile.

# **ADVANTAGES**

- 1 SHG member's attendance will be monitored.
- Individual member's transactions like savings, loan outstanding, over dues and group status can be monitored right away.
- 3 Special loans can be availed without coming to HO.
- The credibility of the SHGs will increase and banks will get more confidence on group's functioning.
- The coordination between the groups and IVDP HO will be strengthened.

The IVDP's Life Security Fund scheme provides protection for individuals and family members who are the legal hirers of the deceased IVDP SHG members. The unforeseen shock due to the death of IVDP SHG member, forces their families into the vulnerable situation.

In order to save the families, the IVDP SHG members contribute and show their joint responsibility towards its deceased SHG members every year.



- ♦ Nominees of the 840 deceased IVDP SHG members received Rs.50,000/-each
- ♦ 8 Seriously hurt & permanently disabled members received Rs. 25,000/- each.
- ◆ Rs. 5000/- is given to the families as funeral expenses for each deceased members.

The LSF distribution programme was held on 12th February 2020 at St. Ann's Hr. Sec. School campus. The Indian Bank, Krishnagiri Zonal Manager, Mr. Thirumavalavan paid the floral tributes to the deceased SHG members and distributed the Life Security Funds to the nominees of the deceased members. The Krishnagiri Divisional Manager of Tamilnadu Grama Bank Mr. Bhaskaran was also present on this occasion. Fr. Sanjay, Ofm has given the homage message during this occasion.

## What is Life Security Fund?

- To show the solidarity and sympathy towards their fellow members, within the limits of the cluster level.
- At the time of joining, a member has to contribute Rs. 100 as a entry fee for LSF. The total collection of this amount is kept as a fixed deposit in the name of IVDP LSF.
- Every year the amount disbursed as LSF will be equally contributed by all the SHG members who have enrolled in the IVDP-LSF scheme.
- Life Security Fund is created to support the family even after the demise of the member.
- This is a different form of life insurance.
- A lump sum is given to the nominee of the deceased and to the member who becomes permanently disabled in an accident.
- This scheme is in existence since 2001.
- This scheme is applicable only for IVDP-SHG members.
- The new members subscription is credited first in their respective SHG accounts and then transferred to IVDP-SHG monitoring fund Account.
- Every year from January to December a list of the deceased members and permanently disabled after accident are prepared and relief fund is given.

#### Special features of the scheme

- Rs. 50,000 is given for the normal deaths.
- Rs. 25,000 is given for the permanent disability in accident.
- It increases the credibility of the groups in the bank for availing loans.
- SHG members share their feelings of cooperation and solidarity towards the family members of the deceased.

#### Conditions for receiving LSF

- The diseased member should have paid their LSF entry fee of Rs. 100.
- Death Certificate has to be produced.
- Natural and accident deaths will be covered under the scheme.
- Suicidal death is not eligible.
- A member who has left the group is not entitled for LSF even if she has paid the LSF subscription. (At the time of death she must be a member in IVDP-SHG)
- Only the nominee proposed by the group members are eligible for receiving LSF.
- Group Resolution in this connection has to be submitted to the respective cluster level federation.
- Loan balance if any in the name of the deceased, will be deducted from the LSF and the balance amount will be disbursed.





### MICROCREDIT AND GENDER BIAS: EVIDENCE FROM TAMIL NADU

#### **ABSTRACT**

Much research shows the positive impact of microfinance or microcredit programmes upon poor women in South Asia and the rest of the world. There is no gainsaying that self-help groups have provided the much-needed peer group to incentivise savings and promote some kind of social solidarity. We also know that the individual routes to empowerment of participating women are not necessarily linear, and can be arduous and challenging as they confront rigid norms and conservative structures.

Over the past two decades, there has been an increasing interest in understanding biases and prejudices that go beyond standard social science quantitative approaches. Psychological tests and methods have increasingly been used to better understand the resilience and depth of biases associated with race, nationalism, and gender in a variety of settings such as the workplace, schools, laboratories, and other public spaces.

Based on evidence gathered from a survey and a psychological test among women participating in a micro-credit programme in northern Tamil Nadu, we argue that micro-credit may empower women in terms of financial decision-making but such a transformation may not necessarily lead to a reduction in an implicit gender bias against women. Conflating empowerment with reductions in gender bias obfuscates the two and can undermine the real potential of the design and delivery of the microcredit programme. We conclude by pointing out that incorporating peer-based mechanisms within programme design may be one relatively under-explored way of tackling gender bias through microcredit programmes.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

India has probably the largest number of microfinance programmes in the world. However, the dark underside of India's gender bias against women keeps rearing its ugly head in the press from time to time. Considering that India has witnessed more than two and half decades of various kinds of microfinance led interventions, it is pertinent to ask whether microfinance has indeed succeeded in bringing about a fundamental shift in gender attitudes among those participating in such programmes.

Based on evidence from the State of Tamil Nadu in India, we argue that microfinance has the proven capacity to usher in explicit changes,1 but has relatively lower impact upon implicit biases. Women participating in microfinance programmes are able to understand and appreciate the social and economic norms that encourage gender equity, but their attitudes, which are much more resilient, towards the same seem to be relatively unchanged. Such a result is not surprising considering that studies on other biases lead to similar results, but it helps provide the insight that gender empowerment does not automatically reduce an implicit bias.

This paper has the following sections. Following the Introduction, the second section on literature review summarises some results on the issue of gender empowerment through microfinance and the usefulness of the Implicit Association Tests (IATs) to further explore microfinance interventions. The third section contains a description of the data sources, sampling, and collection procedure for the paper. The third section outlines the research design and empirical strategy. The final section presents an overview of the results from the data and possible conclusions.

#### 2. LITERATURE REVIEW

It can be said without any doubt that much has been achieved since the Women's Conference in Beijing 25 years ago, but also that much more still needs to be done, especially in the context of the #MeToo movement. The most recent UN Human Development Report points out, "On the positive side women are catching up in basic areas of development. But progress has been uneven as women pull away from basic access into enhanced ones, where gaps tend to be wider" (UNDP, 2019, p. 149). The world is not on track to achieve gender equality by 2030 and it may very well take another 202 years to close the gender gap in economic opportunity (UNDP, 2019, p. 147). The report also highlights an important dimension of gender equality, which is that gender-biased social norms are correlated with a high level of gender inequality. Even though women, in general, are skewed towards a less general bias, 14 per cent of all women exhibit no gender social norms bias as compared to a corresponding figure of 10 per cent for all men, and the share of both with no bias has fallen over the past decade.2 Therefore, gender equality norms and basic capabilities may be improving, but their pace of change is being dragged down as long as biased norms remain resilient.

Microfinance has clearly been one of the most directed interventions aimed at improving the welfare of women and their families. However, there is enough evidence to show that the empowerment of women through microfinance is not conclusive, even if there is potential for such transformation (Beck, 2015). In areas where there is clear and significant evidence that microfinance has empowered women, contextual, behavioural, and programme design characteristics have proven important (Swain & Fan, 2007) (Kabeer, 2005). On the flip side, other scholars point out that empowering women in certain activities can create family-level conflicts and potentially reinforce commonplace gender biases, apart from the well-known double burden argument (Guerin & Palier, 2007). Further, while empowerment does generate agency among women to question the status quo, it seems to have little impact on gender norms (Swain & Garikipati, 2019).

If microfinance indeed has provided agency to women to negotiate their daily household lives but gender norms remain mostly unaffected, what still needs to be examined is whether such daily negotiations are deep enough to help pave the way for successive generations within the same household. Are the changed attitudes among the women enough to bring about transformations within a family even if large-scale structural transformations pose an insurmountable challenge? In other words, have the women changed to such an extent that their hard-won empowerment was indeed worth the fight as it ensures that their children need not go through the same cycle again? Or—counter intuitively but nevertheless quite realistically— was the transformation good for them but possibly not something they would wish upon their daughters to have to go through? Does microfinance bring about a change from within or is it a necessary evil that helps them to adapt to life's complex challenges? In sum, has microfinance brought about an implicit change or is the change an explicit but nevertheless a real change?

Implicit attitudinal changes can prove elusive to capture through standard quantitative approaches, especially survey-based approaches. In this context, IATs, which are psychological tests that measure automatic associations between concepts (Maina, Belton, Ginzberg, & Singh, 2017), can be used to assess the implicit biases of respondents. Implicit attitudes manifest as actions or judgments that are under the control of automatically activated evaluations, without the performer being aware of that causation (Greenwald & Banaji, 1995). Proponents of the test argue that implicit





biases are biases that are wired into our brains and, in fact, constitute part of the cognitive map of an individual. Such tests have been undertaken to understand a variety of identity-based biases such as race, gender, nationalism, and so on. While such habits of the mind seem to be beyond our control, they are not necessarily permanent, and as medical research on neuroplasticity seems to indicate, even hard-wired attitudes can change with the right kinds of interventions.3

There is very little research on the formation of gender attitudes in developing countries, and even lesser on the use of IAT which tests such attitudes. From a recent study, we know that parental influence and peer effects have strong effects on the transmission of attitudes, and that awareness-based interventions can make the attitudes of both boys and girls more progressive, especially in the areas of gender roles, employment, and education (Dhar, Jain, & Jayachandran, 2018). Another study based on IATs showed that exposure to women leaders in local village councils does not alter preferences for male leaders but tends to weaken gender roles in the public and domestic spheres, especially among men (Beaman, Chattopadhyay, Duflo, & Topalova, 2009).

Our results show that participating in self-help group (SHG)-based microcredit programmes has certainly brought about an explicit change in gender attitudes among participating members. However, despite their participation in such programmes for more than a decade, the gender biases of the concerned members remain unaffected by microcredit.

The next section outlines the research design and methodology used in this paper. The subsequent section overviews the results from the data and possible conclusions.

#### 3. DATA

#### 3.1. Study Site

The study was conducted in three districts of Tamil Nadu in collaboration with a Non- Governmental Organisation (NGO) called the Integrated Village Development Project (IVDP), which was founded by Mr Kulandei Francis in the early 1970s. After observing the poor livelihood conditions and high levels of indebtedness prevalent among women in the concerned districts of the State, Mr Francis (who was then a priest but subsequently left the priestly order to fully dedicate himself to social work) decided to organise SHGs for women as a strategy to financially empower households in the area. As of 2018, IVDP had more than 2,00,000 women

members and had distributed almost ₹6000 crores as loans. Mr Francis was bestowed with the Magsaysay Award in 2012, which brought him well-deserved international recognition, but the fact that IVDP has grown in scope and scale over the years is evidence enough of the good work being done by the organisation in northern Tamil Nadu.4

#### 3.2. Sampling

In the study, we used data on explicit and implicit bias collected through a survey conducted on a sample of 513 SHG women, spanning the Krishnagiri, Dharmapuri, and Vellore districts of Tamil Nadu, and comprising the total catchment area for IVDP. The implicit bias of women was recorded via the IAT whereas the explicit bias was measured through a questionnaire. These measurements were part of the survey conducted during November 2018.

We aimed to create our treatment and control groups by ensuring that the women were equally representative on most counts except IVDP membership. To do this, we split the entire list of IVDP

women members based on the number of years of their membership into four quartiles. We then chose members in the top quartile as those who had been sufficiently exposed to IVDP's programme. These women have been members of IVDP for more than 13 years. The bottom quartile consisted of women who have been in the programme for less than two years and formed the population for our control group.

Next, we restricted this population of the top and bottom quartiles to women residing in similar panchayats. We defined these as panchayats having similar gender-based characteristics namely, the sex ratio, percentage of population of females belonging to the Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) categories, the literacy rate of females, and percentage of the working female population. Using a one on one propensity matching technique controlled on these variables, we matched 20 similar panchayats, comprising 136 SHGs and 2060 members) in the treatment group to 18 panchayats, comprising 66 SHGs and 1031 members in the control group. Finally, at a minimum detectable impact size of 0.25 and an assumed standard deviation of 1, we arrived at a sample size of 571 members, including 380 in the treatment and 191 in the control groups. These members were then surveyed for their bias measurements.5

#### 3.3. Data Collection

Our goal was to determine the effect of membership of women in the microcredit SHGs on their implicit and explicit gender biases. We narrowed the meaning of gender bias to be understood as the difference in the attitudes of the respondents in associating a man and a woman in relation to their household and professional work, that is, we wanted to estimate how women perceive gender roles associated with their household and professional work. We measured the implicit bias among women in our sample by employing the IAT, which measures the difference in association speeds of the respondent between targets (man or woman) with the attributes (household work and professional work). We measured the explicit bias of women through a survey-based questionnaire asking the women to respond to a set of pro-male and pro-female-biased statements and vignettes, with the responses being recorded on a five- point Likert scale (Completely Disagree to Completely Agree), which was then quantified.

Since we were unable to conduct a baseline survey for our sample, we used individual-level data of each of these respondents provided by IVDP as baseline covariates for further analysis.

#### 3.4. Descriptive Statistics

Table 1 summarises all the variables used in the study. The mean age of respondents was around 42 years in the treatment group and 31 years in the control group. We used data on the respondents provided by IVDP to generate the indicator variables for education and employment status. Around 67 per cent of the members in the treatment group were educated. The control group had a larger proportion of educated women, at around 76 per cent. A majority of the women in both groups were employed. Only around 2.6 per cent and 7.14 per cent of the women were unemployed in the treatment and control groups, respectively.

The percentages of members in the sample belonging to the SC/ST category were much lower than those of members in the Backward Caste (BC)/Most Backward Caste (MBC) category. More than 95 per cent of the women in the treatment group belonged to the BC/MBC categories. The figure was slightly lower in the control group where around 85 per cent of the women belonged to the BC/MBC





categories. The proportion of women having at least one girl child was similar in both the groups. The treatment group had around 3 per cent more women, with at least one girl child. Around 50 per cent of the women in the control group had their mothers as members of an SHG, whereas the treatment group had only 36 per cent of women with mothers as members in SHGs.

#### 4. EMPIRICAL STRATEGY

The aim of the specifications mentioned below is to determine the effect of IVDP SHG membership on the explicit and implicit gender biases of its women beneficiaries. We estimate the treatment effects in the following way:

Model 1: Yimplicit =  $\alpha 1 + \beta 1T + \Sigma YiZ + \epsilon$ 

Model 2: Yexplicit =  $\alpha 2 + \beta 2T + \Sigma YiZ + \epsilon$ 

Here Yimplicit and Yexplicit represent the measure of implicit gender bias and explicit gender bias of the women beneficiaries, respectively. The implicit bias is recorded as the D-score of the IAT and ranges from -2 to +2. The bias is measured as a strength of association between the two categories, Male and Female, and attributes household work and professional work. Primarily, the test determines the difference in the average association speeds of the respondents between the categories and attributes, that is, the D score is essentially a score of the time taken (which is usually in seconds or fractions of seconds) by the respondents to make the associations between genders and their roles. A positive D-score indicates that the respondent associated females with household work and males with professional work to be stronger than females with professional work and males with household work, hence indicating a pro-male bias. Similarly, a negative D-score indicates a profemale bias.

The explicit bias of the respondent recorded through the Likert score ranges from 1 (Strongly Disagree) to 5 (Strongly Agree). After standardisation of the outcome results, the average Likert score





of all the outcomes serves as the indicator for explicit bias. A higher score indicates that the respondent agrees with the pro-male biased statements, exhibiting a pro male bias. Similarly, a lower score indicates that the respondent has a pro-female bias.

In order to increase the robustness of the model, we use logarithmic transformations of the outcomes. The key regressor is the treatment variable (T), with value 1 indicating that the respondent has been in IVDP's programme for more than 13 years, and value 0 indicating that the respondent has been in IVDP's programme for less than 2 years.  $\beta$  is the average treatment effect, which measures the effect of IVDP membership on implicit and explicit gender bias. Z represents the set of control variables, including the individual-level characteristics of subjects like their caste, employment status, and the employment and education status of the parents and husbands of the respective individuals. It also includes dummy variables, indicating the presence of a girl child and the respondent's self-reported financial standing in the family, measured through questions in the survey.

In order to account for differences in the age and education status between the treatment and control groups, we ran weighted linear regressions on both the outcome variables. We generated the weights through the inverse propensity weighting technique using the age and education variables of the subjects. The propensity score p was calculated to be the probability of finding the respondents in the treatment group conditioned on the age and education status. Subjects with Treatment = 1 received weight 1/p and subjects with Treatment = 0 received weight 1/(1-p).

#### 5. RESULTS

This section contains the results of our analysis. Table 2 represents the effect of treatment on the variables of interest after being weighted for age and education status.

Model 1 indicates the effect of Treatment on the implicit bias of women. The most important finding from this model is that our Treatment effect is statistically insignificant. This means that the members may continue to exhibit the same implicit bias even after being the beneficiaries of IVDP's microcredit programme. To further verify if that indeed is the case, we ran a balance test to check the differences of the means of the D-scores between the treatment and control groups. We found that this test yields a statistically insignificant p-value of 0.37, thereby rejecting the null hypothesis. Hence, we conclude that statistically, the average D-score obtained by women in the treatment group was not different from that for those in the control group.

This model also shows the effect of other covariates on implicit bias. Among all the covariates, we found that the employment indicator is negatively correlated to the implicit bias measure. Employed women seem to have a lower implicit bias than women who are unemployed. Similarly, women belonging to the SC/ST categories seem to have a significantly lower implicit bias than women in the BC/MBC caste category. We believe that while this finding could be due to the low proportion of SC/ST members in the sample, it is an important result that requires further examination through field work and data collection.

While we controlled for the educational status of respondents through weights in the regression, we added the educational status of family members of women as additional controls to the model. We found that the husband's education status is positively associated with the member's D-score. This means that women whose husbands are educated seemed to have a larger implicit bias than women whose husbands were uneducated. Similarly, the mother's education status was also positively associated with implicit bias. Does education reinforce the existing implicit bias in individuals and





households? While we were unable to answer why we found this association through this study, we believe that this is an important question that needs to be examined further. We also believe that this finding opens up avenues for future research on the effect of education on societal bias.

Women whose mothers were part of an SHG seemed to have a larger implicit bias than others. Since this is counter-intuitive, it is difficult to explain why this is the case. Why would a daughter who has been participating for several years, and whose mother has also been a member, tend to be more biased than others? We are unable to explain this result but we wanted to share this result in case it has some implications for understanding gender roles intersecting by age. We find this result to be counter-intuitive.

Model 2 indicates the effect of treatment on the explicit bias of women. We found the average treatment effect to be highly significant and negatively correlated. This means that the members in the treatment group exhibited a significantly lesser explicit bias than members in the control group. This is inconsistent with the result obtained on implicit bias. However, it is also intuitive and nevertheless reassuring. Members who had participated in IVDP's programme for more than 13 years consciously expressed lesser biased views than women in the control group. Model 2 indicates the effect of treatment on the explicit bias of women. We found the average treatment effect to be highly significant and negatively correlated. This means that the members in the treatment group exhibited a significantly lesser explicit bias than members in the control group. This is inconsistent with the result obtained on implicit bias. However, it is also intuitive and nevertheless reassuring. Members who had participated in IVDP's programme for more than 13 years consciously expressed lesser biased views than women in the control group

Women belonging to the SC/ST caste categories seemed to have a significantly lower explicit bias than women in the BC/MBC caste categories. This result is consistent across both our variables of interest. We also found that women who had at least one girl child had a greater explicit bias than women who did not have any female children. Does the presence of a girl child increase the biases placed against women by society? Or can we say that having a girl child tends to make parents more sensitive to biases that are more acceptable to their generations but not to their offspring? This is yet another important finding which we believe needs to be investigated further. Finally, there is a strong negative association between the financial independence indicator and explicit bias. Women who took financial decisions in the household seemed to have a lower explicit bias than women who did not. We believe this finding to be intuitive and a direct consequence of IVDP's financial empowerment programmes.

However, unlike the result obtained in Model 1, there is no significant association between the employment indicator and explicit bias measure. Similarly, the educational status of family members does not have any significant correlation with explicit bias. The association between the indicator of a woman's mother being a part of the SHG and explicit bias is also insignificant, and thereby inconclusive. This further proves that explicit and implicit biases are distinct, and at times contradictory. It may be unfair to conflate these and it is therefore necessary to address the issues with respect to these biases separately.

#### 6. CONCLUSION

In conclusion, we can certainly say that SHG-based microcredit does have a significant impact upon biases at the explicit level. But one should be wary of conflating the explicit talk of gender equality as a reduction in implicit attitudes that inform such biases. Our results show that explicit bias and implicit

bias are indeed quite different from each other. Such a result, though disappointing on the face of it, is not quite different from similar studies that have anticipated results in bias reductions of various kinds of prejudice-based categories but found little to no impact. An experimental study conducted to measure the impact of a gender attitude change programme in government schools of Haryana reveals that the treatment had no significant

impact on the implicit preference for girls measured by IAT6 (Dhar, Jain, & Jayachandran, 2018).

Another experiment compared the effectiveness of 18 interventions to reduce implicit racial preferences. Nine of the interventions that failed to reduce implicit biases featured engagement with others' perspectives, appeal to egalitarian values, and elevation induction (Lai, et al., 2016).

From a policy or programmatic perspective, as mentioned earlier, the significance of design for programme impacts cannot be under-estimated. Much research that is related to changes to implicit attitudes points to the valence of peer effects (Dasgupta & Stout, 2014). It has also been observed that SHGs are peer groups and have been known to be effective because of the solidarity that exists within them. One can perhaps harness this latent capacity inherent to these groups and identify possible small interventions that can be designed for achieving large-scale changes.


