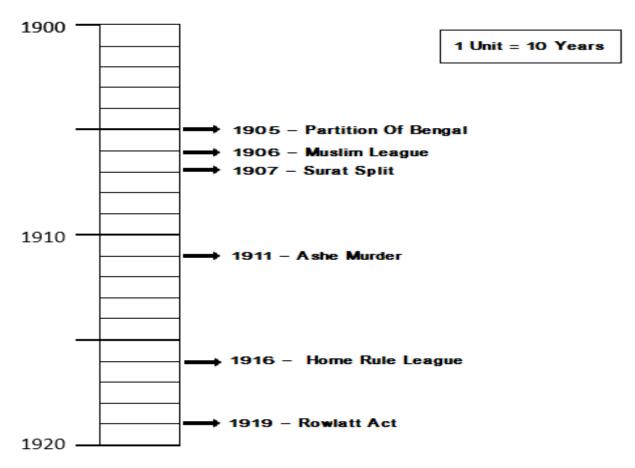

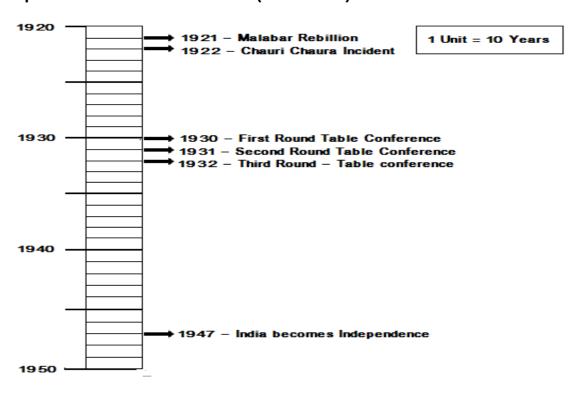

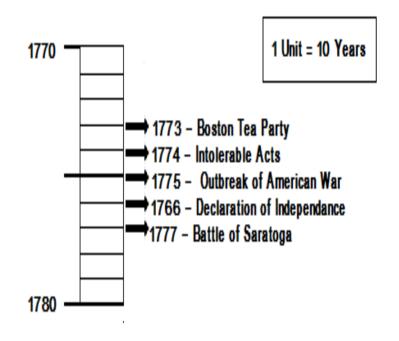
Important events of Indian National Movement (1900-1920)



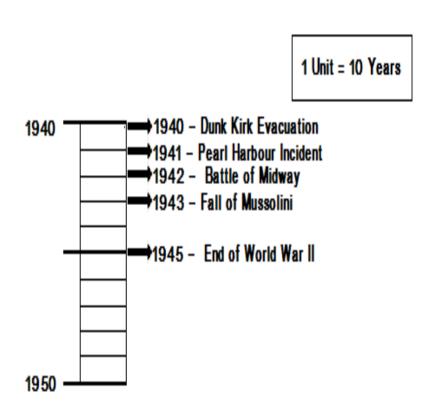
Important Events of Gandhi Era (1920-1950)



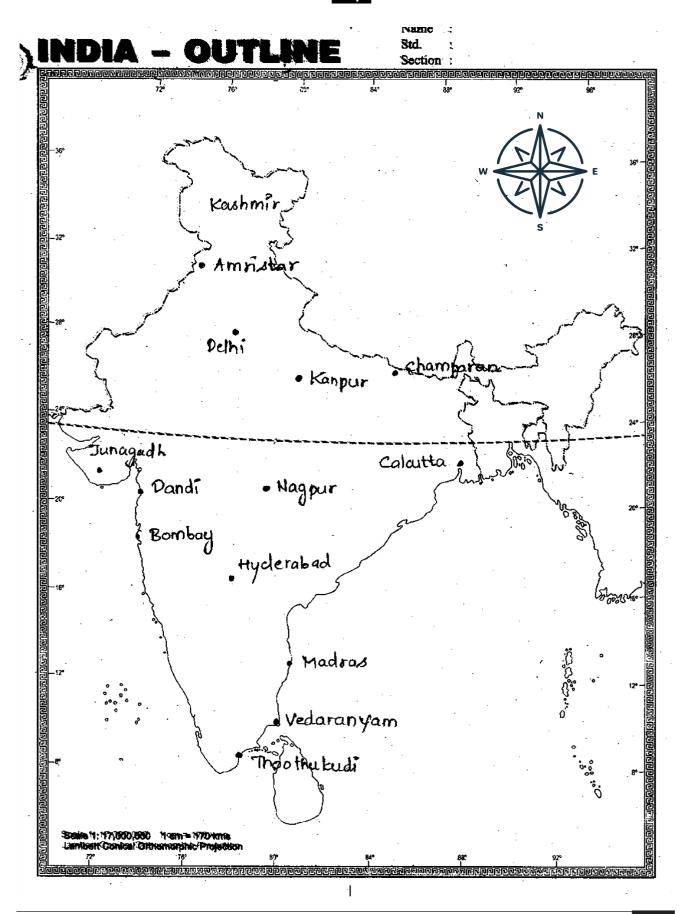
Important events of American War (1770-1780)
